## **Belmont Celebrates Its 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday**

# ELECTION 2016

## **Election Update**

We are now in the home stretch of the 2016 Presidential Election. As a reminder, if you are a vote-by-mail voter, your ballot must be received by the close of polls at 8 pm on Election Day or POSTMARKED no later than November 8 (and received by November 14). This postmark must be done at the post office. If you are mailing your ballot on Tuesday, it would be best to take it in person to a post office to ensure it gets postmarked (dropping it in a sidewalk box is no guarantee of the correct postmark). Remember you can drop your ballot at any polling place within the County on Election Day. The ballot box will be available in the City Clerk's Office at One Twin Pines Lane until mid-afternoon on Election Day. Here are some answers to FAQ's you might have:

***Q. I'd like to vote early, in person. How do I do that?***

A. Three voting centers are available M-F, 8 am to 5 pm, **PLUS** Saturday, November 5, from 10 am to 3:00 p.m.

***Q. Is there a place I can drop my completed ballot over the weekend, or after hours?***

A. Yes, you could stop by one of the three voting centers noted above on Saturday the 5th, or there is a secured ballot box available at the Tower Road address on a 24/7 basis.

***Q. How can I find my polling place?***

A. If you still have your Sample Ballot, your polling place is indicated on that document. If you've already discarded, you can find it by going to <https://shapethefuture.org/MyElectionMaterials/>. Simply type in your address where indicated.

***Q. I'm positive I'm registered to vote, but I never got anything in the mail.***

A. Call the Elections Office ASAP to verify your status: (650) 312-5222.

***Q. How many stamps do I need to put on my ballot if I'm mailing it?***

A. Good news! You need not put any stamps on it. It's postage paid. (This is not true for all counties in California, although the post office will deliver, regardless.)

***Q. I'm registered to vote in San Mateo County, but just recently moved to another address within the County, but I haven't re-registered yet. Can I still vote? And if so, where?***

A. Go to the website listed above for polling places and type in your new address. It will give you the new polling place. You can go there and vote provisionally (or go to one of the voting centers listed above). What this means is that you will be able to vote, but they will hold off counting your vote until they verify your voter registration within the county. Oh, and make sure you re-register as soon as possible!

***Q. I still need to read up on the propositions and the local measures. Where can I find that information?***

A. Your sample ballot has candidate and ballot measure information, and hopefully you received and still have the 200+-page booklet from the Secretary of State's Office that contains all of the State propositions. If you don't have these documents any more, you can access this information at the following website: <https://shapethefuture.org/elections/2016/nov/>, look at "Election Resources" on the left. The City Clerk's office has a few extra copies of the State proposition booklet.

***Q. I'd like to follow election results after the polls close. How do I do that?***

A. Shapethefuture.org has an elections results portal at the following URL: <https://shapethefuture.org/elections/results/2016/nov/>

***Q. I'm not a permanent vote-by-mail voter, and I'm not sure I can make it to my polling place on Election Day. What should I do?***

A. See the first question above where it outlines the voting centers, which are not only open now, but will also be open on Election Day. These voting centers have access to every ballot within San Mateo County. Hopefully one of these locations is in better proximity to you.

***Q. I have other Election questions that aren't addressed here. Who should I call?***

Remember, voting is a privilege. Please exercise your right to vote.



### **Remember to do your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detector Checks this Weekend!!!**



With the need to turn your clocks back one hour this Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, the Belmont Fire Department wants to remind everyone to be sure to change the batteries in both your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors throughout your homes. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), two-thirds of home fire deaths in the United States result from fires in homes without a working smoke alarm. Smoke and Carbon Monoxide detectors are one of the cheapest ways to protect your family in the event of a fire or accidental release of carbon monoxide gas.



But that protection is only possible when these units are kept in proper working order, and when everyone in your family knows what each of them sounds like and how family members should respond.

Every month, you should test each detector to make sure they are working properly. Simply press the test button located on the face of each unit and wait for the beep. Every six months, conveniently when you change the clocks in your home, change the batteries in both types of detectors. Additionally, you should be aware that as of July 1, 2015, all battery operated smoke alarms sold in California are required to have a non-replaceable, non-removable battery that is capable of powering the smoke alarm for at least ten years.



### **Parking Traffic and Safety Committee**

The Parking Traffic and Safety Committee (PTSC) is available to residents to help address parking and traffic concerns in their neighborhood. Residents may submit their concern or recommendation to the PTSC who will evaluate the request based on current policy, regulations, and existing traffic data in the area. The PTSC will also perform field investigations as required. Typical items considered by the PTSC include installation of stop signs, red curbs, streetlights and speed humps, as well as the placement of advisory signs and crosswalks.

Any proposed solution or recommendation will require notification to residents in the area and the item will be placed on a PTSC meeting agenda. Nearby residents may express their support or opposition to an item and offer additional information or input by attending the meeting, or contacting the PTSC via email or phone. Some traffic related items such as the installation of red curb require City Council approval. After review of such items and input from nearby residents, the PTSC will make a recommendation to the City Council for approval. ### **Ralston Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project Update**

Construction of the pedestrian improvements on Ralston Avenue continues. Sidewalk and concrete work continues through to next week. Once completed, the project will provide a continuous and safe pedestrian sidewalk from South Road to the NDNU entrance by installing new sidewalk and new retaining walls.


**Community Workshop - Tahoe Drive and Ralston Avenue Intersection Improvements**




The Belmont-Redwood Shores School District, in collaboration with the City of Belmont, are working on a project to improve several aspects of the intersection operations at Tahoe Drive and Ralston Avenue. The improvements are intended to ease traffic congestion during school drop-off and pick-up, improve pedestrian walkways, and enhance public safety through signalization and signage.

On Thursday night, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, the community attended a meeting to learn about the proposal and to provide input on the proposed enhanced traffic improvements and safety measures.

**Davey Glen Park Construction Update**



This week, the Parks and Recreation Commission received an update on the progress of the Davey Glen Park Project. The Davey Glen Park Project has been under construction since July 2016 and is about 40% complete. This week the construction crews worked on the entrance stairs, ramps, drainage system, park sign, and playground equipment.

Next week the contractor will be working to complete the entrance stairs, ramps, seat walls, park sign, and playground. Current estimate for completion is March 2017 and the project cost \$1,181,000.



**Alexander Park Restroom Project Update**

In addition to Davey Glen Park, the Parks and Recreation Commission also heard an update on the Alexander Park Restroom this week. The new restroom is a pre-fabricated model that includes porcelain amenities inside, a water bottle filler, automatic door locks for nighttime, electric hot water, and is fully ADA accessible. The restroom is under construction at the factory (see photos) and is scheduled to be delivered this month (November). Preparation work is needed at the site including building the foundation, trenching, and utility preparation. Because this work will be disruptive, the Parks and Recreation Department closed the park this week for an estimated period of November and December 2016. Anticipated grand opening in January 2017.





## Storm Division

- Twice weekly inspection of Water Dog Lake roadway, v-ditch, dam, dock and spillway
- Inspected and cleaned Harbor and Ralston Pump Stations
- Performed dissolved oxygen testing on the wet wells at Harbor and Ralston Pump Stations
- Inspected and cleaned 19 "hot spot" locations, on several occasions, throughout the City. These locations are inlets or basins which accept substantial flow (and debris) during rain events
- Open the gates on the drainage standpipe at Water Dog Lake to accommodate increased winter water volume
- Video inspected 599 ft. of storm line
- Swept 155 curb miles resulting in the acquisition of 14.85 tons of debris from the roadways
- Cleaned 36 drain inlets containing Full Capture Trash devices with the use of our combination truck
- Cleaned 144 drain inlet tops which had debris on them as a result of the recent rains

### The Gates Opened At Water Dog Lake Spillway Tuesday Morning At 9:00 Am

Due to the release, higher than normal water levels Belmont Creek during the first 24 hours. The Department of Water Resources Division of Dams requires the spillway gates to remain in the fully open position from November through April 15th. Water releases allows the rainwater to be released in a measured way due to rain events, and are necessary during the rainy season to reduce possible flooding from the lake.

- Cleaned flushable wipes from debris catcher at Ralston Ranch Sewer Pump Station
- Closed out 211 sewer related Hansen work orders (Hansen is a computer program for Asset Management)
- Assisted Storm Division cleaning FTCD (Full trash capture devices) in drain inlets
- Practiced sewer by-pass pumping using the Vactor combo truck in the event of a sanitary sewer overflow or sewer repair requiring sewer main to be blocked for an extended period of time.



Belmont Public Works Sewer staff conducted a practice test for setting up a sewer by-pass in the event of a sanitary sewer overflow. Crews videotaped the practice for own their in-house training for setting up the by-pass system.

The Ralston Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project is now underway. Construction is currently taking place on Ralston Avenue between South Road and the east NDNU driveway entrance. Voters with disabilities who are not able to vote at polling places or at established voting centers can take advantage of a Mobile Voting Center (a mobile electronic voting system that allows a voter to independently and in private cast a ballot away from traditional polling locations).



### WHEN\*

October 11 to November 8, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., 7 days a week.

Voters are required to schedule an appointment for the service.

Voters who contact us Monday through Thursday will receive service the following business day or sooner.

Voters who contact us on Fridays can schedule an appointment for the following business day or sooner if possible.

\*Special accommodations can be made for service outside established hours.

# Early Voting Options Available for Voters with Disabilities

### November 8, 2016 Presidential General Election

The San Mateo County Registration & Elections Division wants to be sure that registered San Mateo County voters with disabilities are aware of the various options available to help them vote during the 29-day period leading up to each election, including the November 8, 2016 Presidential General Election. During this early voting period, registered voters with disabilities may participate in the standard Vote by Mail program, which allows voters to receive a ballot by mail and return that ballot by mail or in person. In addition, registered voters with disabilities have three other options:

- 1 They may request to have a Vote by Mail ballot personally delivered to the voter's home at a convenient time by Elections Division staff, who will assist them in marking and returning the ballot.
- 2 They may request that Elections Division staff bring an accessible version of the County's electronic voting machine to a convenient location such as the voter's home for the voter to cast an electronic ballot privately and independently. This system includes audio ballot reading technology, uniquely shaped large buttons with Braille descriptions, a low height to permit wheelchair-based use, and use of adaptive interface devices such as sip-and-puff and tactile input switches to control the input. The Elections Division staff will set up the equipment and be available to assist the voter during the process.

- 3 They may request that the Elections Division staff arrange free transportation for the voter to and from a Voting Center during the early voting period, where the County's accessible electronic voting machine may be used by the voter.

These options are generally available from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., 7 days a week during the early voting period starting 29 days before the election. Special accommodations can be made for service outside established hours.

To use any of the options listed above, registered San Mateo County voters may contact the Registration & Elections Division at 1.650.312.5222 at least 24-hours in advance in order to schedule assistance.
