Parks



Median maintenance was conducted along Hallmark Drive. Shrubs and trees were trimmed back from the roadway for vehicle clearance. Declining plants and shrubs were also removed from inside the median. Part of the maintenance work included irrigation system repairs.


Several maintenance items were addressed at Twin Pines Park. A water main was repaired in the Redwood Picnic Area. An aging pipe joint sprung a leak. The old pipe was removed and new parts were installed. Vandalism was removed from several locations throughout the park. General landscape maintenance work was also conducted throughout the park.

At O'Donnell Park, an irrigation system was damaged from vandalism and the system was repaired. Sub-surface drip tubing was replaced and set deeper into the dirt to discourage vandalism.

A historic Belmont plaque honoring men and women who have served in any war was reinstalled at the site of the Veterans Memorial in Twin Pines Park. The plaque was originally dedicated May 30th, 1955 and for many years has been on display in the Belmont History Room. The plaque is now mounted on a boulder and offers a reflective moment when seated on the nearby Veterans Memorial. Be sure to stop by and have a look when traveling through Twin Pines Park!

Storm Division

- The Storm Division continued to perform weekly storm pump station preventative maintenance on the 2 storm pump stations
- Inspected and cleaned storm hot spots throughout the city
- Repaired a section of storm main in front of 1160 Broadway
- Inspected and cleaned trash hot spots throughout the City of Belmont
- Performed On land cleanup in various areas of the city per the MRP
- Inspected and cleaned full trash capture devices throughout the city
- Completed first of quarterly inspections and cleaning of full trash capture devices per the MRP for 2018
- Video inspected 1,079 lineal feet of storm main
- Completed first of biannual enhanced school DI inspection and cleaning
- Cleaned up Homeless encampment at the Harbor Storm Pump Station



Sewer Division

The Sewer Division continued to perform weekly sewer pump station preventative maintenance on 11 sewer pump stations as well as hydro cleaning 13,384 lineal feet of city sewer main, both on sewer easements and on the streets in basins 13 and 15

Video inspected 1,676 lineal feet of sewer lines

Assisted Storm Division inspecting and cleaning full trash capture devices throughout the city

Staff is continuing conducting a sewer manhole lid inventory for replacing manhole lids with holes, to reduce the I&I problem into sewer system

Closed out 357 sewer related Hansen work orders

The Old County Road Utility Undergrounding District Project

Project Update (3-2-18)

PG&E continues to work on clearances for electrical energization. PG&E began partial restoration on Masonic Way (between Granada St. & Old County Rd.) and O'Neill Ave. (between Elmer St. & Old County Rd.) to clear out as much of their work as possible. This is to give way to other utility companies (i.e. AT&T, CableCom) who are still working on their cable lines and for the City's Old County Road Street Light Improvements Project. The Old County Road Street Light Project is scheduled to begin on March 5th with potholing in order to install new street light poles and to maintain lighting in the area. PG&E will be removing the wooden poles in approximately 3-4 months upon completion of the overall project. Old County Rd., Masonic Way, and O'Neill Ave. may have lane closures with flaggers on site.

The City understands that this project causes inconveniences for residents during the construction period. Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated.


Other Agency Reports



Stoloski & Gonzalez (S&G) is starting the water main construction at **Arthur Avenue this week** which it is anticipated to last for next 3-4 weeks.

During construction, there may be up to 15 minutes delay for the through traffic as we switch lane directions. To make it easier for the residents, we asked S&G to revise the traffic control plans, and in addition to allowing through traffic add a detour route. This will give residents an option of the one way traffic control or using the detour. Attached please find the revised traffic control plans.

S&G will also place "No Parking Signs" in the construction zone only which is less than 200 LF per day. They will be using a smaller size excavator for this site which will be stored off the road during nights.


Students Make Big Impressions in This Year's MPWD Water Awareness Calendar

BELMONT, CA – On Thursday, January 25, 2018, MPWD hosted the twelve winners of its Annual Water Awareness Calendar Contest. Each year, the District creates a calendar to promote water conservation that features winning student entries. As part of the call for entries, the District asked 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students from schools in its service community to incorporate the expression, “*If Everyone Saves a Little, We Can All Save a Lot!*” into their poster artwork. 128 poster entries were received from five schools: Belmont Oaks Academy, Immaculate Heart of Mary School, Cipriani Elementary School, Nesbit Elementary School, and San Carlos Charter Learning Center (SCCLC). SCCLC 2nd graders also submitted posters that, while not eligible for contest consideration, were included in the calendar. The twelve winners were invited to the January Board of Directors Meeting and presented participation certificates, while gifts cards were presented to the grand prize winner and two runner ups. MPWD also recognized Mrs. Butts, who teaches 3rd grade at Cipriani School, as the teacher with the most student participation.



Invited participants received awards of recognition and copies of the 2018 Water Awareness Calendar from MPWD Director, Louis Vella, and Water Conservation Specialist, Jeanette Kalabolas.

“The imagination and creativity of Belmont’s young students are not only impressive, but it is also a guarantee for future responsible water users in our water district,” announced Acting Board President, Louis Vella, during the award presentations.
