- Belmont's new Parks & Recreation Director who will be joining the City's team on May 2<sup>nd</sup>.



## **Carlmont High Sober Prom 2018**

The Belmont Police, in cooperation with the Belmont, San Mateo & Foster City Fire Departments, American Medical Response and the San Mateo County Coroner's Office, held a two-day "Sober Prom" event on Monday and Tuesday at Carlmont High. The program was designed to raise the awareness of teens to the dangers of driving under the influence of alcohol and/or other controlled substances. A major part of the program was a simulation of an alcohol-related collision scene.

The simulated collision which included an emergency response to the school by Police, Fire, AMR and a Stanford Life Flight Helicopter. Student participants, with simulated injuries, were treated by rescue personnel and the Coroner handled simulated fatalities. Police Officers investigated and arrested the student "drunk driver". The student "drunk driver" was then taken to the Belmont Police Department to be "booked" for drunk driving. At the end of the day, students who participated in the staged accident were removed from the campus. The story of the staged collision, and its aftermath, was filmed and the video will be uploaded to the Belmont Public Safety YouTube Channel soon.

# OFFICIAL NOTICE

CITY OF BELMONT MINIMUM WAGE RATE IS

# \$12.50

per hour

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018

Beginning July 1, 2018, employers who are subject to the Belmont Business License Tax OR who maintain a facility in Belmont must pay to each employee who performs at least two (2) hours of work per week in Belmont, minimum wages not less than \$12.50 per hour.

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Belmont Minimum Wage Ordinance applies to adult AND minor employees who work two (2) or more hours per week (tips not included). Beginning January 1, 2019 the Belmont minimum wage will be \$13.50, January 1, 2020 it will be \$15.00, January 1, 2021 it will be \$15.90, and annually thereafter the Belmont minimum wage will be adjusted based on the Regional Consumer Price Index.

Under the Ordinance, employees who assert their rights to receive the City's minimum wage are protected from retaliation. Employees may file a civil lawsuit against their employers for any violation of the Ordinance or may file a complaint with the City of Belmont. The City will investigate possible violations and will require access to payroll records. The City will enforce violations of the minimum wage ordinance by ordering reinstatement of employees, payment of back wages unlawfully withheld and penalties.

Median maintenance continues at multiple locations this week. Weeds are being cut back and trees pruned. Also, the median irrigation systems are being checked and repaired as necessary. Several medians along Clipper and Concourse Drive received decorative mulch to help hold soil moisture and to suppress weeds. # PUBLIC WORKS

## The Old County Road Utility Undergrounding District Project Project Update (4-20-18)



PG&E and their subcontractors have completed all the electrical conversions on private properties. A project delay was encountered, so the removal of overhead lines and poles tops is now anticipated to occur on the nights of May 17, 18, 19 and 20. PG&E has been working with property owners for the overhead de-energization. The property owners who will be affected have been notified. PG&E began sidewalk restoration but is scheduled to start restoring streets in early June upon completion of the entire project. Other communication utilities will follow after PG&E has completed work and demobilized from the site.


In conjunction with the undergrounding, Tennyson Electric continues construction for the Old County Road Street Light Project, which maintains lighting in the area. Pipe and foundation installation was completed on Masonic Way and continues onto Old County Road. Please be aware that Masonic Way will be **closed** on **Monday 4/23**, due to paving work.

Old County Rd. (between Masonic Way and Harbor Blvd.) and Masonic Way (between Granada St. and Old County Rd.) may have lane closures with flaggers on site. Through traffic is to be maintained.


