## Puma's, Bees, Mosquitos, Oh My!

**That is just a peek at a few booths that popped up in Twin Pines Park this past Saturday for Earth Day.**

Over two dozen canopied booths decorated Twin Pines Park during the Annual Earth Day Celebration on Saturday, April 21<sup>st</sup>.

During the 3-hour event, a few hundred San Mateo County residents dropped off their E-waste, gently-used books for recycling, brought in their confidential documents to shred, and shoveled free compost to use in their garden.

The meadow housed a variety of booths for kids and adults to learn about sustainability and the importance of a healthy environment. Many booths featured children's hands-on activities and games, an abundance of reference material and vendor participants were on hand and came with a plethora of giveaways. A tree workshop and give-away was held by the Belmont Parks and Recreation Department in the Senior Center. Participants learned about tree care, planting and participated in a hands-on tree planting in the park.

Back by popular demand was Belmont local flautist, Jeanette Sacco-Belli with her Native American flutes. Her intimate concert of these beautiful wooden flutes was held in the Community Center adjacent to the park.

### **The numbers are impressive!**

So, how much e-waste was dropped off at the stations during the event? A total of 4,366 lbs. of E-waste collected!

Here is the breakdown of collected E-Waste:

#### E-Waste Collection

CRT's (computers/laptops/monitors): 690 lbs.

Flat Screens: 18 units weighing 193 lbs.

Flat LCD tv's: 4 units weighing 200 lbs.

CPU's (computers): 493 lbs.


Misc. E-waste: 2,506 lbs.

Light Bulbs (CFL's and incandescent): 69 units weighing 36 lbs.

Batteries: 248 lbs.

### City of Belmont has a Local Minimum Wage Starting in July

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018

Beginning July 1, 2018, employers who are subject to the Belmont Business License Tax OR who maintain a facility in Belmont must pay to each employee who performs at least two (2) hours of work per week in Belmont, minimum wages not less than \$12.50 per hour.

The minimum wage requirement set forth in the Belmont Minimum Wage Ordinance applies to adult AND minor employees who work two (2) or more hours per week (tips not included). Beginning January 1, 2019 the Belmont minimum wage will be \$13.50, January 1, 2020 it will be \$15.00, January 1, 2021 it will be \$15.90, and annually thereafter the Belmont minimum wage will be adjusted based on the Regional Consumer Price Index.

Under the Ordinance, employees who assert their rights to receive the City's minimum wage are protected from retaliation. Employees may file a civil lawsuit against their employers for any violation of the Ordinance or may file a complaint with the City of Belmont. The City will investigate possible violations and will require access to payroll records. The City will enforce violations of the minimum wage ordinance by ordering reinstatement of employees, payment of back wages unlawfully withheld and penalties.

### **Parks and Recreation Counselor in Training (CIT) – Learn and Make a Difference**



### **Net Installation at Sports Complex South Field**

Construction is underway at the South Field of the Belmont Sports Complex on the installation of a 40' high net that will protect cars at the Autobahn Dealership and spectators lining up at the snack shack. This is a joint venture between the City and Autobahn, and construction is not interrupting the use of the field by either the girls or adult softball programs.

The net is expected to be completed no later than May 11<sup>th</sup>.





The borders on several plots were repaired at the Barrett Community Garden. Staff also conducted general maintenance in the garden including weed removal around the perimeter of the space. Several irrigation were repairs made on leaking hose bibs.

Median maintenance continues along El Camino Real to repair irrigation systems. Staff is repairing broken sprinkler heads and irrigation valves. During the winter season, when the irrigation system is rarely used, the sprinkler heads become clogged, or damaged by vehicles. The systems must be audited and fixed to maximize water use and ensure proper watering of the trees and shrubs.

At Hallmark Park, grasses and brush are being cleared. Cal Fire Fire Safe crews are assisting with the effort. Invasive species are also being removed. Part of the effort included trimming low hanging and dead branches on the trees. The effort will open up the space to encourage native species while suppressing ladder fuels and creating defensible space. Drains and v-ditches were also cleaned throughout the park.



### **Tree Workshop and Tree Give-A-Way**



On Saturday April 21<sup>st</sup>, Parks & Recreation staff along with Consulting Arborist Walt Fuji conducted the City's first Tree Workshop during the Earth Day Event. Residents learned about proper tree selection, tree care, pruning techniques and planting instructions. Approximately 30 registered residents will receive a tree from the City by selecting a tree from the City's preferred tree species list.

April 21<sup>st</sup> was recognized as Arbor Day 2018 in Belmont and the Belmont 4-H participated by planting two trees in Twin Pines Park at the conclusion of the Workshop.

### Teen Zone

The teens started the week with a game of Pictionary. We also had a Star Wars themed Jeopardy tournament. The snack of the week was turkey picnic sandwiches and apple slices. The cooking craft this week was rice crispy treats. The teens picked two flavors, cookies and cream and original marshmallow. We will end the week with a summer kickoff BBQ, to showcase the newly painted outdoor furniture.



# Public Works

## The Old County Road Utility Undergrounding District Project

### Project Update (4-27-18)



PG&E and their subcontractors have completed all the electrical conversions on private properties. A delay in clearance was encountered, so the removal of overhead lines and poles top is anticipated to occur on the nights of May 17, 18, 19 and 20. PG&E has been working with property owners for the overhead de-energization. The property owners who will be affected have been notified. PG&E began sidewalk restoration but is scheduled to start restoring streets in early June upon completion of the entire project. Other communication utilities will follow after PG&E has completed work and demobilized from the site.

In conjunction with the undergrounding, Tennyson Electric continues with the streetlight construction for the Old County Road Street Light Project, which maintains lighting in the area. Pipe and foundation installation has been completed. Installation of street light poles and partial restoration of the street is planned for the upcoming weeks.

Old County Rd. (between Masonic Way and Harbor Blvd.) and Masonic Way (between Granada St. and Old County Rd.) may have lane closures with flaggers or traffic control on site. Through traffic is to be maintained.

The City understands that this project causes inconveniences for residents during the construction period. Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated. 


