

Governor Releases May Revision of the FY 2018 Budget

On May 11th, the Governor released the May Revision of the FY 2018 Budget. The May Revision projects \$8 billion in additional revenues and proposes \$4 billion in increased FY 2019 General Fund spending above the January Budget proposal, some of which was directed towards local government. Overall, the May Revision projects \$199B in overall spending, with General Fund revenues of \$134M, expenditures of \$138M and a Rainy Day Reserve of \$13.8B. The May Revision proposes to use the surplus on one-time spending to address long-standing infrastructure needs, homelessness and mental health as follows:



MAY REVISION 2018-19

- **Infrastructure (\$2 billion)**—The state has massive liabilities from years of deferred maintenance. The proposal will target these funds to the universities, courts, state facilities and flood control. Investments are also proposed for high-priority capital expenditures.
- **Homelessness (\$359 million)**—In the coming year, new revenues dedicated to addressing the rising cost of housing will begin to flow (from a bond and a fee on real estate transactions). As a bridge to these funds, the May Revision includes a \$359 million package of funding to focus on the state's most vulnerable populations and assist local governments in their immediate efforts to address homelessness, including \$50 million for individuals with mental illness.
- **Mental Health (\$312 million)**—Although primarily a county responsibility, mental health issues affect the entire state. The May Revision includes funding for enhanced early detection of mental health problems and the education of mental health professionals. The proposals include the repayment of \$254 million plus interest in mandate claims to give counties additional resources for youth with mental illness. The May Revision also proposes to place the \$2 billion No Place Like Home bond on the November ballot to accelerate the delivery of housing projects to serve the mentally ill.

A deeper dive into the May Revision reveals that none of the additional funding directed to local government is expected to be received by the City.



Preparing for Wildfire Season

As we approach the summer months, the Belmont Fire Protection District wants to remind residents that wildfire season is approaching. As part of this effort, the Fire District is providing the following information to residents throughout the community;

- Informational Postcards have been distributed to residences in the wildland urban interface (WUI) with the reminder to remove any dead or dying vegetation and to create a defensible space between their property and any grass, trees and/or shrubs that surround it.
- Parks staff continue to partner with the California Department of Forestry (Cal Fire) in reducing vegetation in the open space areas with Conservation Camp crews.

The Old County Road Utility Undergrounding District Project

Project Update (5-18-18)



PG&E and their subcontractors have completed all electrical components of the Rule 20A project on Old County Road. Overhead lines is scheduled to be de-energized by 5pm Sunday 5/20 without major construction work. Therefore, the removal of overhead lines and poles top is anticipated to occur soon. Once the work is confirmed, notifications will be posted since night work has been requested in order to minimize community impacts and traffic congestion. Noise level will be minimal in accordance to the City Ordinance.

The property owners who will be affected have been notified. PG&E began sidewalk restoration but is scheduled to start restoring streets in June upon completion of the entire project. Other communication utilities will follow after PG&E has completed work and demobilized from the site.

In conjunction with the undergrounding, Tennyson Electric continues with the streetlight construction for the Old County Road Street Light Project, which maintains lighting and safety in the area. Street light poles along Masonic Way and Old County Road have been installed. Restoration of the street continues as other minor items are still being worked on.

The Old County Road Street Light Project and the Utility Underground Project are scheduled to be completed at the end of May and June, respectively.

Old County Rd. (between Masonic Way and Harbor Blvd.) and Masonic Way (between Granada St. and Old County Rd.) may have lane closures with flaggers or traffic control on site. Through traffic is to be maintained.

The City understands that this project causes inconveniences for residents during the construction period. Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated.
