FY 2019 Adopted Budget

On June 12th the City Council unanimously adopted FY 2019 Budget and the Master Revenue Schedule. The Adopted Budget was supported by the Audit Committee’s unanimous recommendation and the Capital Plan was found to be consistent with the General Plan by the Planning Commission.

We are pleased to be able to provide a balanced budget. The FY 2019 Adopted Budget builds on successes of past budgets and continues to stabilize the City’s operations, while maintaining the same level of service as in previous years. In development this budget, Council’s top priorities were considered. They are:



As outlined in the City’s reserve policy, both the General Fund and Fire District reserves meet the 33% of operating expense reserve target, totaling \$12.1 million and \$9.5 million, respectively. The City’s and District’s Adopted Budgets and Staffing Plan are summarized in the following table:

The Adopted Budget invests heavily in the City's infrastructure needs. A recent study prepared by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission for Bay Area Cities ranks the City's pavement condition as "at risk" of failure, with a payment condition index of 59. To address this, the Five-Year Capital plan spends more on deferred maintenance than any point in the past few decades. Yet there is still \$173 million (excluding sewers) in deferred maintenance costs that needs to be addressed in a sustainable, recurring way.

The General Fund long-term projection predicts declining reserves due to recent risk mitigation strategies adopted by CalPERS and a mild recession expected in the mid-term. Cumulatively, the components of CalPERS' risk mitigation strategy has resulted in a five-year ramp-up of contribution rates and represent the single most significant challenge during the next five years.

Despite these pressures, the Adopted Budget also places a high priority on replenishing reserves to provide resources and relief to general facility and infrastructure needs. The Adopted Budget assumes a \$1.2 million transfer from the General Fund to the General Facilities and the Infrastructure Funds to address unanticipated repairs, replacements, or projects.




Preparing for Wildfire Season

As we approach the summer months, the Belmont Fire Department wants to remind residents that wildfire season is approaching. As part of this effort, the Department is providing the following information to residents throughout the community;

- Informational Postcards have been distributed to residences in the wildland urban interface (WUI) with the reminder to remove any dead or dying vegetation and to create a defensible space between their property and any grass, trees and/or shrubs that surround it.
- Parks staff continue to partner with the California Department of Forestry (Cal Fire) in reducing vegetation in the open space areas with Conservation Camp crews.

Public Works



The Old County Road Utility Undergrounding District Project Project Update (6-15-18)



As of June 14th, PG&E finished the electrical conversion from overhead to underground utilities within the Old County Road Rule 20A project boundary. The underground system is in operation. Overhead conductors have been removed, and poles were cut down to the communication level or removed. PG&E may be working on some minor restoration items, but all major work has been complete. The attached photos depict the area before and after the conversion.

Pre-Construction (Before)



Comcast and AT&T are currently converting their facilities to underground. AT&T will remove the remaining stub poles and restore the sidewalk once this is complete. Comcast and AT&T work is anticipated to be complete mid-September.

In conjunction with the undergrounding, Tennyson Electric approaches the completion of the Old County Road Street Light Project, which maintains lighting and safety in the area. Street light poles along Masonic Way and Old County Road have been installed and energized.
