City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress

Progress on this important customer service project continues and is on schedule. Demolition is complete and, this week, the contractor installed metal stud framing, completed electrical rough-in, and relocated fire alarm devices, electrical and HVAC. They expect to start working on the two 3rd floor door frames early next week.

The Permit Center has been temporarily relocated to the 3rd Floor of City Hall during construction. Informational brochures providing more detailed information on the project, including interim Permit Center accommodations, are available on the City's website.

Belmont Police Department Twitter The Belmont Police Department posts crime alerts, news, information, and emergency notifications on their Twitter page. You can view these tweets with or without a Twitter account. You can receive tweets via SMS texts to your mobile device by following [@belmontcapolice](https://twitter.com/belmontcapolice) and enabling text alerts within your account settings. If you choose not to create a Twitter account, you can still receive text alerts on your mobile device by texting "follow [belmontcapolice](https://twitter.com/belmontcapolice)" to the number 40404. Belmont Nextdoor Nextdoor is an interactive online neighborhood community for Belmont residents. Sign up based on the neighborhood where you live. The City and City Departments have the ability to post on Nextdoor to one, several or all neighborhoods as needed. San Mateo County (SMC) Alert SMC Alert is a free, county-wide alert notification system operated by the San Mateo County Office of Emergency Services and is used to immediately contact you during urgent or emergency situations. Select the group "Belmont" and/or any town in the county. You can receive updates via email or text messages. Typically, alerts posted on SMC Alert are of a more serious or urgent nature. Belmont Creek Gauge Monitor Belmont Creek runs from Water Dog Lake in western Belmont to the SF Bay and is part of Belmont's storm water management system. A creek level monitor is located at Harbor Blvd & Old County Rd. The National Weather Service and City staff receive data from this monitor and are alerted when the creek level is approaching possible flooding conditions. City Launches New Informational Websites

New Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Measure Webpage


On June 26, 2018, the City Council adopted a resolution calling a municipal election on a measure to increase the City's transient occupancy tax (TOT) rate from 10% of the rent charged by the operator to 12% of the rent paid by the hotel guest. The measure is set to be on the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election ballot.

The City's TOT, or Hotel Room Tax, was last changed in 1978 and does not apply to the markup charged by on-line platforms such as Airbnb. The proposed measure will change the TOT to apply to the markup charged by on-line platforms and bring the City's TOT rate to 12%, which is the rate currently charged by most other cities with a TOT in San Mateo County. The proposed measure is expected to bring in an additional \$560,000 in unrestricted general city revenues annually. The revenue would be administered by the City and used exclusively for city needs such as fixing potholes in city streets, repairing sidewalks, maintaining city police patrols and crime prevention, emergency response, maintaining parks, open space and sports fields. The State could not take any of the revenue from the City. The measure is approved if it receives at least a simple majority of votes (fifty percent plus one) at the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election.

New Street Pavement Website

In an effort to improve information about the City's pavement program and projects in the coming years, the City is launching the new [Belmont Pavement](http://www.belmont.gov/BelmontPavement) Website. This site will be a location where you'll be able get information about all things related to pavement in one convenient location. By way of background, the City is responsible for the operation, repair and maintenance of approximately 70 centerline miles (140 travel lane miles) of streets with a pavement replacement value of over \$227 million in present day (2018) dollars.



In November 2016, Belmont voters approved the *Belmont Streets and City Services Measure* (Measure I), a half-cent general tax that will generate approximately \$1.3 M annually for local infrastructure. The City Council has allocated \$1.0 M per year towards street pavement beginning with Fiscal Year 2018.

Furthermore, on April 28, 2017, the Governor signed Senate Bill (SB) 1, which is funded by the newly established Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), which receives four sources of new revenue to address basic road maintenance, rehabilitation and critical safety needs on both the state highways and local streets and road system. RMRA sources of funds are increases to the per gallon, fuel excise taxes; diesel fuel sales taxes, and vehicle registration fees; and it provides for inflationary adjustments to tax rates in future years. The City anticipates receiving \$160 K in Fiscal Year 2018 and approximately \$600K-700K in future years as a result of this funding.



City Council Nomination Period Now Open

The four-week nomination period for the City Council election on November 6, 2018, opened on Monday, July 16th. The nomination period runs four weeks, until the close of business on Friday, August 10th. The nomination period is extended by five calendar days (to August 15th) if any incumbent does not file. This extended period is then only open for non-incumbents. There are three Council seats to be determined, those held by Charles Stone, Warren Lieberman, and Julia Mates, all of whom are eligible to run again since Belmont does not have term limits. Belmont voters who are interested in seeking a seat on the City Council should contact the City Clerk's office to make an appointment to pick up nomination papers. They must be obtained in person, they cannot be mailed. Contact the City Clerk's office at cclerk@belmont.gov, or by calling (650) 595-7413.



In addition to the three Council seats, the City Council placed three local measures on the November ballot – to determine whether the City Clerk and/or City Treasurer positions should be appointive rather than elected, and a potential increase in the hotel ([transient occupancy tax](#)) from 10 to 12 percent.




National Night Out

Merry Moppet Preschool / Belmont Oaks Academy Project

Merry Moppet Preschool & Belmont Oaks Academy (MM/BOA) is expanding on its 1.5-acre site campus at 2200 Carlmont Drive.

The new classroom building at Merry Moppet is moving forward and is ready for inspections for plumbing and electrical. The Merry Moppett Lane side of the building is ready for window and stucco installation, and the remaining portion of the steel structure is in the final stages of bolting and welding.



490 El Camino Real:

This mixed-use (residential/commercial) project includes construction of a four story 73-unit residential condominium building and a stand-alone 4,909 square foot single story commercial building; the residential units range from one to three-bedrooms in size. An underground garage (138 spaces) will serve the residential units, and 29 at grade spaces will be provided.

The project includes outdoor patio areas, common area open space, as well as a fitness center.

The south portion is in the beginning stages of finish work for the units and the north portion is in the final stages of drywall for the corridors and units. The retail shell is receiving the outer cladding and stucco and the owners are looking to this fall for units in the south portion to be available for sale.



600 El Camino Real

This development project consists of a mixed-use (residential/commercial) building located on three parcels (approximately 0.9 acres in combined area). The three-story building would include approximately 11,000 square feet of retail space at the street level, and 1, 2 and 3-bedroom condominiums at the upper levels (32 residential units). Street-level commercial parking, basement parking for residents, and a public court and landscaped rear yard is also proposed.

The inspections for exterior waterproofing and window flashings are complete. The interior drywall at the corridors and units is in progress as most of the units have received rough inspections for electrical, mechanical, plumbing and framing.



Hilton Homesuites Hotel - 1201 Shoreway Road

The project includes the construction of a five-story, 62,640 square foot hotel on a one-acre property (former Empire Lumber site). The 96-room hotel will also include meeting room, breakfast, and ancillary food preparation areas, an indoor fitness area, outdoor second floor deck/patio with kitchen/bar and seating, and an indoor pool/spa. A surface parking lot for 73 vehicles will be provided for the hotel. Vehicular access to the site will be provided via a driveway from Shoreway Road.

The exterior lathe is being installed in preparation for stucco and rough inspections are moving ahead in the guest rooms. Most of the corridors have received drywall inspections and the rear stairway construction is in progress.



Public Works Project Updates and Traffic Advisory

Ralston Retaining Wall Repair Project

The Ralston Retaining Wall Repair project consists of constructing approximately 165 linear feet of new retaining wall, installing new railings on top of an existing retaining wall, cleaning and waterproofing the surface of an existing retaining wall. Hillside Drilling Inc. began construction on Monday July 16th. They will be working behind shoulder closure starting at 7:30am until 9am when lane closure begins on Ralston Avenue. There are two locations along Ralston Avenue as part of this project: (1) near Pullman Avenue and (2) between Chula Vista Drive and South Road. Work scheduled for the week of July 24 includes drilling, saw cutting, calking, washing and sealing, demolition, excavation, painting. The project is anticipated to be complete at the beginning of August.

Ralston Sewer Rehabilitation Project – Phase II

As part of the ongoing sanitary sewer rehabilitation capital improvement program, the City's contractor is finishing replacement of the sewer main on Hiller Street between Wessex Way and Masonic Way. The project involves trenchless upsizing of the existing 6-inch sewer pipe using horizontal directional drilling technology. Three service laterals will be re-connected to the new pipe. This project will provide the neighborhood with a reliable infrastructure with extended service life, greatly improve capacity, and protect public and private property from potential sanitary sewer overflows.



Ralston Avenue & Tahoe Drive Roadway and Traffic Signal Improvements

The contractor (Interstate Grading & Paving/Columbia Electric) will continue to construct concrete retaining walls and drainage, install new irrigation lines to the center median, and installation of new pull boxes, conduits, controller pads for the new traffic signals, and demolition of the island within the intersection of Ralston Avenue and Tahoe Drive. Lane closures expected along Ralston Avenue between 9am-3pm, traffic will be affected at the Tahoe Drive intersection as well.

Ralston Avenue & South Road Intersection Project

The contractor (Columbia Electric) will continue to work on the installation of the remaining traffic signal foundations, install conduit, and work on the sidewalk improvements on the northwest corner of the intersection. Lane closures expected on Ralston Avenue between 9am-3pm. Shoulder work permitted between 8am-5pm.

Ralston Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation Project Phase II**Hiller Street:**

The contractor (Express Plumbing Services) will be continuing to work on Hiller Street between Ralston Avenue and Wessex Way installing sewer laterals and working on the new installed sewer main. Road closure with detours expected in this area.

Chula Vista Drive at Ralston Avenue:

The contractor will also start work on Chula Vista Drive at Ralston Avenue potholing and performing soils investigation work. Traffic will be closed to one lane with flaggers in the work zone at times. Lane closures on Ralston only permitted 9am-3pm, lane closures on Chula Vista Drive is 8am-5pm.

Belmont Sewer and Water Rehabilitation Project**Davey Glen Road:**

KJ Woods will be completing the installation of Water Main (WM) tie-in connections, service connections, and fire hydrant transfers. Davey Glen Road will be closed to through traffic at El Camino Real and Middle Road from 8AM to 5PM Monday through Friday. Flaggers will be present for mobilization assistance.

Villa Avenue (Easement):

KJ Woods will be doing easement preparation for the pipe bursting of the sewer main. The following construction activities will take place; temporary sewer connections, permanent installing of lateral connections, manhole repairs, backfilling and restoration. Belburn Drive will be closed to through traffic between Academy Avenue and Villa Avenue starting Monday, July 23rd from 8:00am – 5:00pm. Flaggers will be present for mobilization assistance.

Belburn:

KJ Woods will be conducting easement preparation, manhole and bypass preparation and trench execution insertion from Belburn Drive to Villa Avenue. The 8" Sewer Main and 8" Water Main lateral connections and service connections will be installed. Belburn Drive will be closed to through traffic from Academy Avenue to Villa Avenue starting Monday, July 23rd from 8:00am – 5:00pm. Flaggers will be present for mobilization assistance.
