# Highlights

## Belmont Turns Out for National Night Out 2018



This past Tuesday, August 7<sup>th</sup>, the Belmont community participated in the 35<sup>th</sup> annual National Night Out. National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live. This year there were a record 14 NNO event locations in Belmont, ranging from block parties to simple get-togethers. As always, Belmont's NNO was a whole community event involving residents, multiple City departments including Police, Fire, Parks and Rec. and Public Works along with utilities such as Mid-Peninsula Water District.



**Fire Personnel Continue Work at Northern California Wildfire**



Belmont Fire personnel continue firefighting efforts at the Carr Fire in Shasta & Trinity Counties. Crews continue to actively reinforce containment lines and support suppression activities. As of August 10<sup>th</sup>, Belmont firefighters have been deployed for 14 days and it is anticipated they will be demobilized from the incident as soon as August 11<sup>th</sup>. To date, the Carr Fire has burned over 181,000 acres, destroyed over 1,500 structures and continues to threaten another 528 structures and is 51% contained.





**City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress**

This important ADA compliance project for the City is ahead of schedule and progressing smoothly. This week, more drywall was installed and finished in the Lobby area and substantial progress was made installing the drain line, drywall and backing for the ADA compliant drinking fountain in the Lobby hallway. Work also began on the backing, rough-in and telecom cabling for the Lobby electronic displays (smart TVs). The contractor will be working towards completing all drywall finishes so that painting can begin next week. Tile work will also begin in the bathroom and Lobby perimeter and salvaged items will be reinstalled. The PD Lobby is now open to the public. The Permit Center has been temporarily relocated to the 3rd Floor of City Hall during construction and interim Permit Center accommodations are available on the City's website.



**Belmont Wins California State Planning Award!**



The APA (American Planning Association - California Chapter) recently informed the City that Belmont has won the State of California **Comprehensive Plan Award: Small Jurisdiction** for the **2035 General Plan, Belmont Village Specific Plan, and Climate Action Plan**. These three comprehensive long range plans were adopted by the City in November 2017. The awards ceremony will be held at the annual California APA Conference this October

in San Diego where Belmont will be recognized for this significant accomplishment. The APA California Awards Event will highlight the best planning policies, projects and people throughout the State. The purpose of the APA California Awards Program is to encourage quality in planning and increase the public's awareness of the planning profession by recognizing outstanding achievement in the planning field.


This award follows the **APA California - Northern Chapter - Award of Excellence** given to Belmont in June for these three plans.

**PG&E Care Program – Underutilized in Belmont**

San Mateo County ranks fourth on PG&E’s list, with some 12,600 estimated households that might qualify for reduced rates but have not enrolled in PG&E’s CARE program. **Thousands of Income-Eligible PG&E Customers Could Save Money by Simply Signing Up for the CARE Program**

**SAN FRANCISCO, Calif.** —Thousands of customers could save up to 20 percent or more on their monthly energy bill by taking a simple step -- enrolling in Pacific Gas and Electric Company’s (PG&E) [California Alternate Rates for Energy \(CARE\) Program](#).

The CARE program gives income-qualified households deep discounts on their energy bills, but nearly one in 10 eligible customers are not signed up for the program and are missing out on significant savings.

“PG&E is here to support our customers needing assistance. Qualified households can take advantage of the CARE program to help them manage their energy costs and lower their monthly bill,” said PG&E Senior Vice President and Chief Customer Officer Laurie Giammona.

PG&E estimates more than 150,000 customers throughout its service area could save on their monthly costs by enrolling in CARE. In Sacramento County alone, which has the largest number of eligible customers not enrolled, more than 40,000 households could lower their bills by simply signing up for CARE.

Currently, more than 1.4 million qualified customers throughout Northern and Central California are enrolled in CARE. PG&E has helped customers save more than \$9 billion on their energy bills through the program.

Customers can [apply for CARE online](#) or via paper applications that are available through numerous community agencies throughout PG&E’s service area. Applying is easy and only takes about five minutes. If they qualify, customers will begin receiving the CARE program discount within their next billing cycle.

Every year, the California Public Utilities Commission adjusts the maximum qualifying income levels for CARE to reflect changes in the federal poverty guidelines. CARE is funded through a rate surcharge paid by all utility customers.



#### Ralston Retaining Wall Repair Project

The Ralston Retaining Wall Repair consists of constructing approximately 165 linear feet of new retaining wall, installing new railings on top of an existing retaining wall, cleaning and waterproofing the surface of an existing retaining wall. Hillside Drilling Inc. began construction on Monday 7/16. They will be working behind shoulder closure starting at 7:30am until 9am when lane closure begins on Ralston Avenue on weekdays. There are two locations along Ralston Avenue as part of this project: (1) near Pullman Avenue and (2) between Chula Vista Drive and South Road.

Work scheduled for the week of August 13th includes removing and replacing the sidewalk as well as cleanup work at the lagging wall. Contractor will start lane closure earlier next week from 8am to 3:30 pm. The revised schedule will allow the contractor to finish most of the work before schools start. We will monitor the work area in case adjustments to the schedule are needed.

### Ralston Avenue & Tahoe Drive Roadway and Traffic Signal Improvements

Interstate Grading & Paving will be backfilling the retaining wall, installing ADA ramps, and installing electrical boxes. Lane closures are expected along Ralston Avenue between 9am-3pm, and traffic will still be affected at the Tahoe Drive intersection as well.

### Ralston Avenue & South Road Intersection Signalization Project

McGuire & Hester will continue to install conduit for the traffic signals, work on the sidewalk improvements on the northwest corner of the intersection and along the north side of Ralston Avenue, and form up the curb ramp at South Road. Lane closures are expected on Ralston Avenue between 9am-3pm. Shoulder work is permitted between 8am-5pm.

### Ralston Retaining Wall Repair Project, CCN2018-557

The Ralston Retaining Wall Repair consists of constructing approximately 165 linear feet of new retaining wall, installing new railings on top of an existing retaining wall, cleaning and waterproofing the surface of an existing retaining wall. Hillside Drilling Inc. began construction on Monday 7/16. They will be working behind shoulder closure starting at 7:30am until 9am when lane closure begins on Ralston Avenue on weekdays. There are two locations along Ralston Avenue as part of this project: (1) near Pullman Avenue and (2) between Chula Vista Drive and South Road.

### 2018 Slurry Seal Project – Measure I, CCN 2018-564

Construction began August 3rd with dig-out work. Dig out work is now mostly complete. Crack sealing will follow in preparation for the slurry seal. Please see the slurry schedule is below. There will be street closures and no parking from 8-5pm during the slurry work. However, the roadway will be opened by the contractor as soon as the seal is dry, and it is safe. Striping layout is anticipated to be installed within 24 hours after the street is opened to traffic. Letters from the contractor will be sent and no parking signage will be posted.
