## Highlights

### **City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress**

This ADA and customer service improvement continues to be ahead of schedule and is nearing the completion of Phase I (Construction). This week, substantial work was done in the Police Department area, as the saw cut and demolition for the afterhours transaction window area was completed and carpet was removed in the Police Department foyer and small conference room. Work continues on installing data cabling in the Permit Center for data to the future counter, workstations and monitors, and floor leveling will be installed in preparation for carpet installation early next week. Ceiling tile will also be installed next week. The water fountain was installed on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor Lobby and painting of the hallways on Floors 1-3 of City Hall continues and is nearing completion. The Permit Center continues to be temporarily relocated to the 3rd Floor of City Hall during construction and information regarding interim Permit Center accommodations are available on the City's website.

Phase II of the project (Furniture and Finishes) is expected to begin in mid- to late September. There will be a short pause between phases as materials are fabricated and furniture is delivered and installed. The Lobby will reopen for access (PD Lobby will be open to the public) upon completion of Phase I.

**Belmont Police Department Twitter** The Belmont Police Department posts crime alerts, news, information, and emergency notifications on their Twitter page. You can view these tweets with or without a Twitter account. You can receive tweets via SMS texts to your mobile device by following [@belmontcapolice](https://twitter.com/belmontcapolice) and enabling text alerts within your account settings. If you choose not to create a Twitter account, you can still receive text alerts on your mobile device by texting "follow [belmontcapolice](https://twitter.com/belmontcapolice)" to the number 40404. **San Mateo County (SMC) Alert** SMC Alert is a free, county-wide alert notification system operated by the San Mateo County Office of Emergency Services and is used to immediately contact you during urgent or emergency situations. Select the group "Belmont" and/or any town in the county. You can receive updates via email or text messages. Typically, alerts posted on SMC Alert are of a more serious or urgent nature. **Belmont Creek Gauge Monitor** Belmont Creek runs from Water Dog Lake in western Belmont to the SF Bay and is part of Belmont's storm water management system. A creek level monitor is located at Harbor Blvd & Old County Rd. The National Weather Service and City staff receive data from this monitor and are alerted when the creek level is approaching possible flooding conditions. Creek levels and other data are provided for information purposes only.

# Public Works Updates

## Street Pavement Website

In an effort to improve information about the City's pavement program and projects in the coming years, the City is launching the new Belmont Pavement Website. This site will be a location where you'll be able get information about all things related to pavement in one convenient location. We look forward to keeping the community informed about our work as we improve the City's aging infrastructure!



A few FAQs found on the site are:

### Q: How does the City determine which streets to schedule for preventive maintenance work?

A: A computerized pavement management system is used to store the condition data of all roads. This system, known as StreetSaver, was developed by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) and is helping Bay Area cities and counties. The system utilizes a computer model, which predicts the proper time to perform preventive maintenance work. To keep the system up to date, the City periodically surveys the condition of the City streets to determine the condition of the pavement and updates the condition data of all roads which are maintained in the model on regular bases. StreetSaver utilizes a model, which predicts the proper time to perform preventive maintenance work. The most cost-effective pavement maintenance application is selected based on the amount of funding available each year and street need.

### Q: When will my street be resurfaced? Is my road going to be paved soon?

A: In order to maximize the dollars available to preserve its entire network of pavement in the best condition, the City relies on its pavement management system (StreetSaver) to preliminarily select candidate streets for further evaluation. Unfortunately, not all streets will be treated with the annual available funds. However, with the passage of Measure I, the City drafted a 5-year pavement program, which is the first part of the 30 year tax measure. This enabled us to evaluate all City streets. Streets not found on the initial draft list will be considered in the next cycle of the pavement program. Please note that maintenance of streets are tentatively scheduled in order to accommodate planning and design purposes, which may include utility coordination, inspection of drainage issues, addition of sidewalks, addition of bicycle and pedestrian pathways, etc.

**Overview**

The City is responsible for the operation, repair and maintenance of approximately 70,000 linear feet of road (one mile) of streets with a pavement replacement value of over \$227 million in present day (2018) dollars.

In November 2016, Belmont voters approved the Belmont Streets and City Services Measure (Measure I), a half-cent sales tax that will generate approximately \$1.1 million annually for local infrastructure. The City Council has allocated \$1M per year towards street pavement beginning with fiscal year 2018.

On November 10, 2017, the City Council signed Resolution 18-001, which is funded by the newly established Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), which replaces four sources of non-revenue based road maintenance, rehabilitation and critical safety needs on both the state highways and local streets and road system. Public sources of funds are expected to be the gas tax, fuel excise taxes, street fuel sales taxes, and vehicle registration fees and provides for inflationary adjustments to tax rates. In future years, City anticipates receiving \$10M in total fiscal year 2018 and approximately \$100M in future years as a result of this funding.

The first project to be funded with Measure I and SB funds is the 2018 Storm Drain Project. This project will fund approximately seven (7) concrete miles of streets and on-lane construction during the summer of 2018.

**Five Year Paving Program (2019-2023)**

Given the passage of both Measure I and SB I, these new funding sources provide an annual funding estimate of about \$1.1 to \$1.3 million for pavement maintenance, which equates to a funding estimate of \$8.5M over the next 5 years. In addition, the City Council has allocated \$2M in Measure I funds to fund the program for a total of \$10.5M over the next 5 years.

The 5 year program is based on the following guidelines:

1. Utilize the City's pavement management program, StreetSaver, as a platform to find the most cost-effective way to manage City streets.
2. Include an assessment of streets for functional obsolescence.
3. Consider a compensation or alternative due to the heavy usage.
4. Exclude an assessment of streets to be funded around the City.
5. Aggregate or needs to recommended treatment plan for continuous construction and to maximize efficiency in resources and traffic.
6. Allocate treatments to residential/commercial streets that would not be chosen by StreetSaver, but are commercial/business areas, schools and parks and routes to school, and including residential streets with history of complaints and maintenance issues.
7. Minimize amount of street grid that has needed repair/treatment.

The City may not be able to fully comply with the program as the most cost-effective way to manage the program may not be the most cost-effective way to manage the program. The program may be subject to change without notice due to project delays, budget, and other unforeseen circumstances.

#### 2018 Slurry Seal Project – Measure I, CCN 2018-564

The City sent out notifications to affected residents very early this summer about the construction work. In addition, the contractor has sent out door hangers as the scheduled work approaches. No parking signs are also posted 24-48 hours prior to the work and should be the most up to date. Public Works does post notifications on our project page and social media outlets as soon as we can, especially if there are any delays or changes.

*We kindly remind residents, neighbors, and all passer byers to drive around any wet slurry and striping before it has a chance to cure to avoid diminishing the value of the slurry seal and tax dollar investment.*



## Parks

Irrigation repairs were made at several locations including along Ralston/El Camino Real, at Fox Field and the Sports Complex. A defective irrigation valve and broken pipe was repaired in the Grade Separation landscape near El Camino Real. At Fox Field, corroded pipe was replaced with long lasting PVC. The challenges associated with the old galvanized metal pipe include corrosion and leaks and decreased pipe diameter from sediment, which diminishes water flow. In the attached photo, the old corroded galvanized pipe is visible, and it is easy to see how this sediment and corrosion lessens the functionality of the pipe. A leaking gate valve was replaced on the South Field at the Sports Complex.



At Belameda Park, the retaining walls were repaired. Loose blocks were reset, and capstone were reset and adhered to the retaining wall. General landscape maintenance work took place, including weed removal and shrub and tree pruning.

Additional landscape maintenance work was conducted at the Sports Complex and along El Camino Real. Trees and shrubs were pruned around the perimeter of the North Field. Weeds and undesirable shrubs were also removed. On El Camino Real near 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, weeds and undesirable plants were removed from a retaining wall and back from the sidewalk. Litter and debris was also removed.

## Community Learning Center

Owen, Skyler, Lucille, and Lucas are moving on to kindergarten and had a goodbye party for the class. The four families sponsored a Bounce House at BCLC for all the children to jump in.
