# Highlights

## Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Relay Comes to Belmont



On Monday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, first responders from all over the Bay Area converged at Belmont City Hall as part of the 2018 Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Relay. This annual event, which began in Mountain View and ended in San Francisco, involves participants making stops at a number of locations along the Peninsula to collect funds for the Alisha Ann Ruch Burn Foundation. Representatives from the Belmont Firefighters Association presented a check for \$600 toward this very worthy cause. Their donation will help pay for a number of programs and services the foundation provides such as Champ-Camp, a week-long residential summer camp for burn survivors, ages 5-16 years.

The mission of the Alisa Ann Ruch Foundation is to enhance the quality of life of burn survivors and promote burn prevention education. At age 8, Alisa Ann Ruch was fatally injured in a backyard barbeque accident. In 1971, her parents partnered with Southern California firefighters to start the foundation, a non-profit organization. The foundation works with hospitals, fire departments, safety coalitions and other organizations across California to develop innovative programs and services. Burn Prevention education is key in avoiding agonizing burn injuries and survivor services are paramount to improving the quality of life for courageous burn survivors.

## City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/ Customer Service Remodel Progress

Although there is a short pause between phases of this significant ADA compliance project, progress continues, as furniture was delivered and the Permit Center workstations were installed this week. Painting is completed on all 3 floors of City Hall. ADA compliance upgrades were also completed in the Lobby bathrooms and fire alarms are scheduled to be installed next week so that those restrooms can be opened for public access.

Construction crews will be returning in late September to commence Phase II (Furniture and Finishes), as the Permit Center counter installation scheduled for September 27<sup>th</sup> through October 1<sup>st</sup>. The Permit Center continues to be temporarily relocated to the 3rd Floor of City Hall until the completion of Phase II. Information regarding interim Permit Center accommodations are available on the City's website.

## ***Public Works Traffic Advisories***

---

### **Ralston Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation Project Phase II:**

#### **Ralston Avenue:**

Express Plumbing Services will be continuing work on Ralston Avenue between Coronet Avenue and Alameda de las Pulgas. The contractor will be performing paving restoration and cleaning up the center median on Monday, September 24, 2018. Once the contractor completes this work they will be moving down Ralston Avenue between Alameda de las Pulgas and Villa Avenue. This work is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, September 25, 2018 through Friday, September 28, 2018 with extended construction hours from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. Traffic evaluations will take place and granted working hours will be adjusted accordingly at the City of Belmont discretion. Traffic control and flaggers will be in place during these working hours.

### **Belmont Sewer and Water Rehabilitation:**

#### **Francis Avenue, Academy, and Davey Glen Road:**

KJ Woods subcontractor Bortolotto Paving will continue paving the roadway on Francis Avenue and Academy Avenue on Monday, September 24-25, 2018. They will then move onto Davey Glen Avenue on Tuesday, September 25 and 27, 2018. This work will take place between normal working hours of 8:00 am – 5:00 pm. Road will be closed to through traffic, residents and emergency vehicles will have access. Thank you for your patience and understanding during construction.

### **Tahoe at Ralston Avenue Intersection Project:**

#### **Ralston Ave at Tahoe Drive:**

Columbia Electric will be continuing to excavate and install conduits for the new traffic signals. This work is scheduled for the week of Monday, September 24, 2018 to Friday, September 28, 2018. One lane of traffic may be needed, traffic control will be in place between the hours of 9:00 am – 3:00 pm.

### **Shoreway Sewer Replacement Project:**

#### **Shoreway Road:**

Contractor (Cratus Pipeline) will be potholing for utilities along Shoreway Road and starting to install new sewer main between Motel 6 and Cormorant Drive. Traffic control with one lane closed and flaggers will be stationed. This work is scheduled for the week of Monday, September 24, 2018 to Friday, September 28, 2018 with normal working hours of 8:00 am – 5:00 pm.

### **1401 Shoreway Sewer Replacement Project:**

#### **Shoreway Road:**

Contractor (Preston Pipelines) will be potholing for utilities along Shoreway Road between Cormorant Drive and 1385 Shoreway Road . Traffic control with one lane closed and flaggers will be stationed. This work is scheduled for the week of Monday, September 24, 2018 to Friday, September 28, 2018 with normal working hours of 8:00 am – 5:00 pm.

## **California Coastal Cleanup Day - Belmont Creeks to Bay 2018**

On Saturday, September 15, 2018, The City of Belmont held its annual Belmont Creeks to Bay event, as part of the state-wide California Coastal Cleanup Day. 114 volunteers signed up at City Hall to help clear trash in several targeted Belmont locations.

The total weight in trash and recyclables collected was 360 lbs. The most unusual items collected were party decorations and half of a car engine block. The most collected item was cigarette butts; counted at a whopping 3,398.

The City of Belmont would like to give a big thank you to everyone who came out and volunteered. Honorable mention goes to the following groups: Girl Scout Troop 62481, Kiwanis Club of San Carlos, and V.O.I.C.E.S. (Volunteer. Outreach. Involvement. Community. Events. Service.).

It is imperative that we as a community do our best to keep all waterways clear of harmful debris. The City of Belmont will continue to support water pollution prevention efforts by distributing pollution prevention information and providing the public with litter reduction items such as pocket ashtrays.



## *Parks and Recreation Updates*

### **Barrett Community Center**

Improvements are being made at Barrett Community Center. After years of heavy use, sections of asphalt are being removed and repaved near the Multipurpose Room and blacktop. The fresh asphalt will replace cracked and crumbling sections. Parks maintenance staff spent most of the week cutting out sections and prepping for fresh asphalt. Proper removal and preparation of the sections will ensure the longevity of the new asphalt. Over the years, as the uses at Barrett Community Center have changed, the parks maintenance team has worked diligently to adapt to those evolving uses and maintain Barrett as a safe, enjoyable and usable space for all, and this repaving work is part of that effort.



**O'Donnell Park**

At O'Donnell Park, several irrigation repairs were made. The water main sprung a leak near an irrigation valve. In this instance, the old pipe glue failed causing a leak at the pipe fitting. The water supply to the park was shut down and staff made the repair. Staff used the opportunity to replace and upgrade several components along the pipe while it was exposed.

**Sports Complex**

Landscape maintenance work continued at the Sports Complex. Shrubs and trees were trimmed for general health and aesthetics. Several trees were trimmed in the Sterling Downs neighborhood for vehicle and pedestrian clearance in the right of way.

# SENATE BILL 1/PROPOSITION 6: UNDERSTANDING THE FACTS



## WHAT IS SB 1/STATE TRANSPORTATION FUNDS?

Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, is a landmark transportation investment package that increases funding for transportation infrastructure across California by more than \$5 billion annually over the next 10 years.

SB 1 investments, funded by a combination of gas taxes and vehicle registration fees, are split equally between state-maintained transportation infrastructure and local transportation priorities including local streets, transit, and pedestrian and bicycle projects.

## WHAT IS PROPOSITION 6?

Proposition 6 on the November 2018 ballot is intended to repeal SB 1.

## WHAT HAPPENS IF PROPOSITION 6 PASSES?

If Proposition 6 passes, SB 1 fuel taxes and fees would be repealed. Gas and vehicle fees would be somewhat cheaper, but current SB 1-funded projects in San Mateo County to improve highways, roads, bridges, trails, pedestrian safety, and travel would be delayed indefinitely or cancelled. Proposition 6 would also require voter approval for any new, higher, or extended fuel tax or vehicle fee in the future, requiring alternative funding sources for future transportation projects.



## WHAT ARE THE STATE TRANSPORTATION FUND INVESTMENTS IN SAN MATEO COUNTY?

- **\$21.5 million** to fix potholes and improve safety on local streets and roads.
- **\$4.5 million** towards bicycle, pedestrian, and safe routes to school improvements.
- **\$14.5 million** towards make bridges safer and repair traffic devices on state highways.
- **\$164 million** contribution to upgrade and improve Caltrain service.
- **\$250 million** contribution to address congestion on the US 101.
- **\$1.83 million** for climate change adaptation planning to protect the transportation network to the effects of climate change.



## SB 1 FUNDS STAY IN TRANSPORTATION

On June 5, 2018, California voters approved Proposition 69, ensuring that the new funding remains dedicated to the transportation programs listed in SB 1.



## OVERSIGHT OF STATE TRANSPORTATION FUNDS

SB 1/state transportation funds will have strict accountability and transparency measures.

SB 1/state transportation funds created the Independent Office of Audits and Investigations, including an Inspector General, appointed by the Governor, who will serve as the director of the Audits and Investigations Office.

Cities and counties are required to publicly adopt project lists and provide year-end reporting on completed projects.



## US 101 MANAGED LANES PROJECT

Currently there is no carpool or express lane on US 101 in San Mateo County north of Whipple Avenue, forcing buses and carpools to share lanes with solo drivers. As envisioned, a managed lane would help ease congestion by creating an incentive to use transit or carpool without removing any existing travel lanes.



Approximately \$235 million in SB 1 funding has been awarded to San Mateo County to address congestion along the US 101 corridor. These funds, together with additional local, regional, and private funding will allow construction of a managed lane in both directions on US 101 and creation of a pilot express bus service program, which will work together to incentivize carpooling and transit use on US 101 in San Mateo County.
