

Measure KK - Belmont Hotel Room Tax Measure

On June 26, 2018, the City Council adopted a resolution calling a municipal election on a measure to increase the City's transient occupancy tax (TOT) rate from 10% of the rent charged by the operator to 12% of the rent paid by the hotel guest. The measure (Measure KK) is set to be on the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election ballot.

The City's TOT, or Hotel Room Tax, was last changed in 1978 and does not apply to the markup charged by on-line platforms such as Airbnb. The proposed measure will change the TOT to apply to the markup charged by on-line platforms and bring the City's TOT rate to 12%, which is the rate currently charged by most other cities with a TOT in San Mateo County. The proposed measure is expected to bring in an additional \$560,000 in unrestricted general city revenues annually. The revenue would be administered by the City and used exclusively for city needs such as fixing potholes in city streets, repairing sidewalks, maintaining city police patrols and crime prevention, emergency response, maintaining parks, open space and sports fields. The State could not take any of the revenue from the City. The measure is approved if it receives at least a simple majority of votes (fifty percent plus one) at the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election.



Belmont residents will also vote on Measure CC, Measure WW and three City Council seats. If enacted, Measure CC would make the City Clerk's office an appointed position. If enacted, Measure WW would make the City Treasurer's office an appointed position. The Belmont City Council also has three seats up for election.

Ballot Box



As part of the effort to make more ballot boxes available to voters, two temporary exterior boxes have been installed in Belmont, one at City Hall and one at the Belmont Library on Alameda. They will be available on a 24/7 basis through election day. A drop-off box is also located in the City Clerk's office on the third floor of City Hall, for those who prefer, which is available during regular business hours.

In addition, several voting centers are now open, with several more coming being added starting October 27, and even more starting November 3, including the Emergency Operations Center at Belmont City Hall.

City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress

Phase II of this ADA compliance project is picking up, as the wood paneling for the back wall of the Permit Center is scheduled to be installed beginning on Monday, October 22nd. Lobby signage will be installed soon after the paneling is complete. The contractor is also scheduled to finish installation of the 3rd floor door windows. The project team is still focused on addressing an issue with the transaction drawer for the after-hours window and believes a solution to be in place. The painters are also scheduled to return for spot painting in the main stairwell, as well as any necessary touchups in the Permit Center.

The Permit Center continues to be temporarily relocated to the 3rd Floor of City Hall until the completion of Phase II. Information regarding interim Permit Center accommodations are available on the City's website.



San Mateo County 9-1-1 Centers Now Taking Text-to-911

Effective immediately, all San Mateo County Law Enforcement and Fire Agencies 911 Dispatch Centers, including Belmont, are equipped to receive and respond to mobile phone SMS Text to 911 messages. All phones or devices must include a text or data plan, be text capable, and have their location services enabled to send a text message to 911. Callers who cannot communicate verbally are now able to use the text to 911 service to request help directly from local public safety agencies. This technology directly benefits members of our deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired communities as they will now have a more efficient and effective way to request emergency services in times of need.




Additionally, those who find themselves in a situation where it may be too dangerous to dial 911 will have another option to call for help during an emergency. For the deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired communities, texting to 911 is always an acceptable way to contact 911 for help. Others should only use the text to 911 feature when speaking to a 911 Dispatcher is not possible or may place an individual at risk. Examples include a domestic abuse situation, an active shooter incident, or an incident that has caused injury resulting in an inability to speak. Otherwise, it is always best to dial 911 and speak with a dispatcher directly.

Here are some helpful tips when using the Text to 911 service:

- Always provide the exact location of the emergency
- Text messages should be brief and easy to understand
- Do not use abbreviations, emojis or slang
- Remember that the ability to send/receive images and videos is limited and often dependent on the cellular provider
- Texts can only be received in English at this time - this service will be available in additional languages in the near future
- Do not include others when texting to 9-1-1 (no group texting)

Remember - Only call 911 in the event of an emergency and only text to 911 when calling is not an option. For more information on text to 911 visit the San Mateo County Communications Manager's Association website at www.CMASMC.com

ADOPT-A-STORM-DRAIN



Take part to help keep our waterways clean

All storm drains in Belmont go directly to Belmont Creek and into the San Francisco Bay. In order to keep them flowing properly and to minimize localized flooding during rain events, protecting our waterways and keeping them clear is key to water pollution prevention and flooding prevention.

A clean community is a happy community

The city has a comprehensive preventative maintenance program to inspect, monitor, and maintain 1,400 of our storm drain inlets throughout the city. Regular scheduled street sweeping is in place, with enhanced sweeping during winter months. “No Dumping-Flows To Bay” storm drain placards are installed on every storm drain. The Belmont Public Works Department has also installed trash capture devices in 69 storm drains where litter activities have been an issue.

When leaves, litter, and other harmful waste enter the storm drain, not only can it cause backups, but is unsightly in our neighborhoods. Not to mention, litter and other pollutants can harm wildlife, fish, and the environment.

The City of Belmont has started Adopt-A-Drain Program for residents to take part in being proactive in their neighborhood.

What is Adopt-A-Drain?

Residents

Any resident can adopt a drain in their neighborhood. Just fill out the [online form](#) and select an address location of the storm drain from the Adopt A Drain map that you would like to adopt. Once you have adopted a drain, be committed to keeping the top of the grate clear of leaves and trash. Report illegal dumping and drainage, and any backups that are coming from below the grate or if the inlet below the grate has trash. Staff will come out and remove the grate to clear any blockage.

Once you have signed up, you will receive an Adopt-A-Drain starter kit.


PARKS AND RECREATION



Several non-functioning irrigation valves were replaced at Hidden Canyon Park. The existing valves were not automated and unreliable. New irrigation valves and a timer were installed. The irrigation installation is the first phase of a tree planting project along the entranceway to Hidden Canyon Park. For this tree planting project, the parks department will partner with the local girl scout troop to fulfill our Arbor Day tree planting commitment. Stay tuned for updates about the tree planting.

General landscaping maintenance was conducted at multiple sites including Belameda, O'Donnell, Semeria, and Alexander Parks. Fall pruning is underway as vigorous summer growth and spent flower heads are being cut back. Fall maintenance also includes the cleaning up of drainages due to leaf drop. At Belameda Park, graffiti was removed from multiple surfaces, including the picnic tables.
