## City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress

Phase II of this significant ADA compliance project is picking up, as crews have begun installation of the wood paneling in the Lobby, which will continue through early next week. Lobby signage is currently being fabricated and is scheduled to be installed the week of November 12<sup>th</sup>. Installation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor door windows is complete. Painters are also scheduled to return for spot painting in the main stairwell, as well as any necessary touchups in the Permit Center. Within the next few



weeks, Phase II will wrap up with moving the Permit Center back down to the Lobby, as soon as all power and data is connected and tested.

Given the unique issues the project team has been addressing regarding the transaction drawer for the Police Department after-hours window, the project has now been split into three phases. Phase III will primarily address a feasible solution for this part of the project. Despite having to address several unforeseen circumstances, the project team is working diligently to keep costs down as this project nears completion.

The Permit Center continues to be temporarily relocated to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor of City Hall until the completion of Phase II. Information regarding interim Permit Center accommodations are available on the City's website.

## **400 El Camino Real**

The retail component of this mixed-use (residential/commercial) project is noted in the foreground. This portion of the project is receiving final touches at the street frontage of the corner El Camino Real and Davey Glen Road. The south wing of the residential building is in the final stages of sales office/model unit completion. The developer is looking forward to the middle of November to begin showing the model units.



## **600 El Camino Real**

This mixed-use (residential/commercial) project is in progress of interior and exterior finishes. Thirty-two condo units and commercial space on the ground level will be a welcome addition to the El Camino Real corridor.



**1201 Shoreway Road**


The 96-room Homewood Suites Hotel project is beginning exterior stucco applications; construction plans have been submitted for the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor swimming pool. Interior finishes are underway throughout.



**Merry Moppet School**

The new two-story classroom building at Merry Moppet School is planned to open at the end of November. Exterior finishes, window installations and landscaping are in progress. Founded in 1948, this is a great addition to a longtime Belmont institution.



## SEWER AND STORM DIVISION

### Water Dog Lake Water Release



Please be advised that Public Works Maintenance Staff will open the gates at the Water Dog Lake spillway on Thursday November 1, 2018 at 9:00 am. Residents may notice higher than normal water levels in Belmont Creek within 24 hours after the gates are open. The Department of Water Resources Division of Dams requires the spillway gates to remain fully open from November 1st through April 15th. Water releases allows the rain water to be released in a measured way due to rain events and are necessary during the rainy season to reduce possible flooding from the lake.

### STREETS DIVISION

#### Traffic and Electrical Operations Weekly Highlights

##### Ralston Avenue Speed Radar Sign

City staff removed and replaced radar signs along Ralston Avenue. The previous signs were not functioning properly, and the older hardware/software were no longer available. The new signs are programmable. They are set to flash and warn drivers that they are violating the posted 25MPH speed limit, when children are present. The signs also flash and warn drivers that they are violating the 40MPH speed limit during other times.



##### Fire Station 14 "KEEP CLEAR" road markings

The Ralston Avenue road markings in front of the driveway received a fresh coat of paint. It is important to keep the driveway clear, so personnel can respond to an emergency in a timely manner.

## Road Repair

The Streets Division dug out 15.84 tons of failing asphalt on Notre Dame Avenue between Belle Monti Avenue and Miller Avenue. The crew put down 21.21 tons of hot mix asphalt, compacting and fixing the problem.



## PROJECT UPDATES

### **2018 Slurry Seal Project – Measure I, CCN 2018-564**

The construction for the 2018 Slurry Seal Project is now complete. The project included dig-out repairs, patching, crack sealing, and slurry seal treatment, striping and associated updated signage on approximately seven (7) centerline miles of streets on 34 street segments. This light maintenance project was one of the first to use construction funding from available Measure I and Senate Bill (SB) 1 funds.

The City appreciates the community's patience and support as the project was carried out and further pavement rehabilitation plans are continued.

## ADOPT-A-STORM-DRAIN



### Take part to help keep our waterways clean

All storm drains in Belmont go directly to Belmont Creek and into the San Francisco Bay. In order to keep them flowing properly and to minimize localized flooding during rain events, while also protecting our waterways and keeping them clear, is key to water/flooding pollution and prevention.

### *A clean community is a happy community*

The city has a comprehensive preventative maintenance program to inspect, monitor, and maintain 1,400 of our storm drain inlets throughout the city. Regular scheduled street sweeping is in place, with enhanced sweeping during winter months. “No Dumping-Flows To Bay” storm drain placards are installed on every storm drain. The Belmont Public Works Department has also installed trash capture devices in 69 storm drains where litter activities have been an issue.

When leaves, litter, and other harmful waste enter the storm drain, not only can it cause backups, but is unsightly in our neighborhoods. Litter and other pollutants can also harm wildlife, fish, and the environment.

The City of Belmont has started an Adopt-A-Drain Program for residents to take part in being proactive in their neighborhood.

### What is Adopt-A-Drain?

#### Residents

Any resident can adopt a drain in their neighborhood. Just fill out the [online form](#) and select an address location of the storm drain from the Adopt A Drain map that you would like to adopt. Once you have adopted a drain, be committed to keeping the top of the grate clear of leaves and trash. Report illegal dumping and drainage, and any backups that are coming from below the grate or if the inlet below the grate has trash. Staff will come out and remove the grate to clear any blockage. Once you have signed up, you will receive an Adopt-A-Drain starter kit.

## Twin Pines Master Plan Update




