

Permit Center to Close on Tuesday, November 20st

The City would like to thank you for your patience during the various stages of our Permit Center ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel process. The permit center will reopen to full operation on Wednesday November 21st.

City Hall Lobby ADA Compliance/Customer Service Remodel Progress



Phase II of this ADA compliance project is progressing and nearing completion. Lobby and outdoor Police Department signage has been installed. A new Point of Sale system has been activated to modernize cashiering. Data cabling has been tested successfully, and one of the large display monitors will be mounted early next week; the second monitor is on order and will be installed in the coming weeks. Painters will be returning to spot paint the main stairwell, as well as any necessary touchups in the Permit Center.

Staff has confirmed that the Permit Center is moving back down to the Lobby this Tuesday, November 20th. The Permit Center will be closed on Tuesday and will reopen on Wednesday, which will complete Phase II. As previously reported, given the unique issues the project team has been dealing with regarding the transaction drawer for the PD after-hours window, the project was split into 3 phases. Phase III will address the PD interior lobby and the night window. Staff believes to have found a successful solution and is working with the contractor to implement the work.



Belmont Fire Personnel Deployed to Wildfire in Northern California

On Thursday, November 8th, Belmont firefighters were deployed as part of a two San Mateo County Strike Teams to the Camp Fire in Butte County. In addition to Belmont, fire personnel from Menlo Park, Woodside, San Carlos, San Mateo, Foster City, Central County (Burlingame, Hillsborough & Millbrae), San Bruno and South San Francisco responded. The Camp fire started the morning of November 8th and as of November 16th has burned over 142,000 acres, destroyed 9,844 residences, 336 commercial and 2,076 other buildings, and is only 45% contained. Deployment of these Strike Teams, each of which consists of five engines and a Battalion Chief, shows the true value of having a statewide mutual aid system in California.



The Fire Department also wants to remind residents of the importance of maintaining an area of 30'-100' of defensible space around your property by cutting back grass, shrubs and trees around structures. For more information on mitigating the wildfire threat [click here](#).

Series 2018 Sewer Treatment Facility Revenue Bond Rating

On November 13th, Council authorized the sale of Sewer Treatment Facility Revenue Bonds, Series 2018 to fund a portion of Belmont’s share of the Silicon Valley Clean Water’s Capital Improvement Program (RESCU project), intended to cover project-related costs through 2019. Staff submitted the bond documents and other related economic and financial information to Standard & Poor’s rating agency for their consideration, and the Bonds have received a AA- rating with stable outlook. An official rating report has been issued. The City and the Belmont Joint Powers Financing Authority intend to sell the bonds by competitive sale in December. With that sale timeframe, the City and the Authority will receive proceeds of the bonds shortly thereafter.

Project Updates

Ralston Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation Project Phase II

On the week of November 19th, the contractor, EPS, will be fusing 800 feet of 24" pipe in the center median of Ralston Avenue between Academy Drive and Avon Street. The city will continue to evaluate and modify the traffic control as well as working hours and will adjust accordingly at the City of Belmont discretion. Traffic and pedestrian control will be in place during these working hours to help alleviate traffic congestion and pedestrian safety. Thank you for your understanding and patience during this challenging project.



Shoreway Road:

On the week of November 19th, the contractor (Cratus Pipeline) will be continuing to excavate and install the new 18" PVC sewer main along Shoreway Road. Extended working hours are 7:00 am – 5:00 pm. The contractor is currently working at a unique location on the project where additional measures of compaction and trench backfill need to be implemented due to some roadway settlement issues. Temporary traffic signals have been installed for afterhours traffic control, but during the normal working hours flaggers and pedestrian control will be in place to help alleviate traffic congestion and assure pedestrian safety. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this challenging project.

STREET DIVISION

Weekly Highlights

- Performed 27 USA mark outs
- Filled 6 potholes at various location throughout the City
- Dug out 4.22 tons of failed roadway on Notre Dame and replaced with 4.91 tons of new asphalt
- Completed the top lift of a major roadway repair on Carlmont Dr. with 14.01 tons of new asphalt.



TRAFFIC ADVISORIES

- Monday November 26, 2018 to Tuesday November 27, 2018 – Traffic control will be set up on Ralston Ave and Notre Dame Ave will be closed. The drill and mixing system will be set up at Notre Dame Ave and Ralston Ave. In order to be able to successfully pull 800' of 24" pipe we will need to have everything prepared on Monday. The pipe will be connected to the reamer head and set up in the insertion pit at the proper elevation to begin reaming. The traffic control will remain in place over night Monday so that we can begin reaming and pulling the pipe first thing Tuesday morning at 5:00AM. Once the process starts on Tuesday morning, we will not be able to stop until the entire 800' of pipe is in the ground. We will then remove the reaming head from the pipe and pull the pipe into the manhole alignment. The drill and mixing system will be removed from Ralston Ave and placed in the staging area on Notre Dame Ave. The traffic will be opened up for Notre Dame Ave. If the above schedule cannot be met due to unforeseen problems, EPS will immediately notify the City and an alternate plan will be determined by the City and EPS.
- Wednesday November 28, 2019 to Tuesday December – EPS will only be utilizing the middle island on Ralston Ave to rehabilitate the manholes and reconnect the laterals. Asphalt will be restored, and any striping will be replaced.

Parks, Fields and Facilities

Brush was cut back in the open space above John Brooks Trail, near Hallmark Drive. The vegetation management serves several purposes- to remove dead and declining shrubs and brush, as well as for storm preparation. A v-ditch is being cleared of debris and vegetation growth. The parks maintenance team partnered with public works to clear the space. Trees in the area were pruned for general health as well.

Along Hastings Drive, open spaces and right-of-ways adjacent to the sidewalks were cleaned up. Weeds and shrubs were removed and pruned where necessary. Our parks department manages several spaces along Hastings Drive and this work is conducted several times a year. Weeds and seasonal grasses were mowed on several medians on Marine and Island Parkway.



At Twin Pines Park, dead and declining shrubs were removed and replaced with fresh plantings. The replacement shrubs were planted behind the Senior Center. At Semeria Park, trees were pruned for general health and sidewalk clearance. While onsite staff made minor repairs and adjustments to the irrigation system.
