## **CITY OF SAN CARLOS RESPONDS TO RISK OF CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)**

(San Carlos, CA, March 10, 2020) – In an abundance of caution, the City of San Carlos declared a State of Emergency and has opened its Emergency Operations Center (EOC), following the County of San Mateo’s declaration of a State of Emergency last week. The purpose of the City’s declaration is to ensure we work with our partners to keep our community informed and safe and make ourselves eligible for federal emergency funding.

The State of California has notified the County of San Mateo and the City of San Carlos that passengers from the Grand Princess cruise ship needing care, but not hospitalization, will be coming to San Carlos to be temporarily housed.
