


February 7 – The Petrified Forest



Too unstable for love, Alan departs, but soon finds himself back at the diner, held prisoner -- along with several others -- by a desperado (Humphrey Bogart). (1936) *On the menu: Chicken Stroganoff*

February 21 – A Streetcar Named Desire

After losing the family plantation to creditors, aging Southern belle Blanche DuBois (Vivien Leigh) travels to New Orleans seeking solace in her sister, Stella (Kim Hunter). Instead, she goes toe-to-toe with Stella's brute of a husband, Stanley (Marlon Brando). (1951) *On the menu: Chicken Parmesan*



Foreign Films - 2nd & 4th Tuesdays




February 14 – White

Polish immigrant Karol (Zbigniew Zamachowski) is humiliated in a public courtroom by his wife (Julie Delpy) during their divorce proceedings. Shamed and brokenhearted, he finds an ally in a fellow countryman, and the two eventually concoct a way back to post-Communist Poland, where Karol sets about rebuilding his life. Rated R. (France) *On the menu: Orange Chicken Stir-fry*

February 28 – Red (Irene Jacob)

An accident brings together two very different people: Valentine (Irene Jacob), a model, and Joseph (Jean-Louis Trintignant), a retired judge. Since love chooses to pair people's hearts at random, theirs becomes a fated and deeply improbable, but altogether true, romance. Nominated for three Academy Awards. Rated R. (France) *On the menu: Grilled Cod*




February 1 – Deepwater Horizon

February 8 – Girl on the Train

During her daily rail commute, divorcée Rachel Watson (Emily Blunt) observes the happily married couple living in a house near the train route. One day, she witnesses a scene that enrages her -- and soon finds herself deeply entangled in the ensuing mystery. *On the menu: Beef kabobs*

February 22 – Manchester by the Sea







February 2 – Brian's Song

This highly-acclaimed winner of five Emmy Awards is the true story of a special relationship between two professional football players for the Chicago Bears, Gale Sayers (Billy Dee Williams) and Brian Piccolo (James Caan). As the first interracial roommates in the history of the NFL, whose friendship brought out the best in both players. Winner of 4 Emmy awards. *On the menu: Chicken Piccata*

February 9 - Sabrina

When a budding romance between his rakish younger brother (Greg Kinnear) and the family chauffeur's charming daughter (Julia Ormond) threatens to blow a big business deal, busy industrialist Linus Larrabee (Harrison Ford) has to clear his slate to break up the relationship. Nominated for multiple Golden Globe and Oscars. *On the menu: Spaghetti Bolognese*



February 16 – Much Ado About Nothing

Young lovers Hero (Kate Beckinsale) and Claudio (Robert Sean Leonard), soon to wed, conspire to get verbal sparring partners and confirmed marriage-phobic rivals Benedick (Kenneth Branagh) and Beatrice (Emma Thompson) to wed as well. Set in Florence, Italy, this is a Shakespeare comedy whose lively plot involves complications, pranks and peerless wordplay. Also starring Michael Keaton, Denzel Washington, and Keanu Reeves. Nominated for multiple multinational awards. *On the menu: Honey-glazed pork loin.*

February 23 – The Big Easy

When a New Orleans police detective (Dennis Quaid) is assigned to investigate a series of mob-related slayings, he's forced into regular contact with an assistant district attorney (Ellen Barkin) determined to prove that the cops are up to their necks in graft. Recipient of several international awards. Rated R. *On the menu: BBQ Pork ribs*
