## Measure I

On August 12, 2016, City, County, and State agencies finalized the November 2016 ballot. Belmont residents will have the opportunity to vote on Measure I, the only local measure on the November 2016 ballot.

The November 8<sup>th</sup> ballot is expected to be one of the longest ballots in recent history. Belmont voters will have the opportunity to vote for President, Congress, the State Legislature, and at least 17 separate statewide and countywide ballot measures. Belmont's local measure will be placed at the end of the ballot, so please be sure to read all the way to the end in order to vote in Belmont's local election.

If enacted, Measure I, also known as the Belmont Streets and City Services Measure, is a ½ cent local funding measure that will generate approximately \$1.3 million annually. Measure I is a general sales tax measure, and could be used for infrastructure repairs such as neighborhood streets, roads, and storm drains, as well as public safety. Measure I will expire in 30 years, and requires citizen's oversight, independent annual audits, and all funds spent locally. No Measure I funds may be taken by the State or used for other purposes. Vote by mail ballots will begin going out the week of October 10<sup>th</sup>. Vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked on or before November 8<sup>th</sup>. Vote-by-mail ballots may also be dropped off at any polling place on November 8<sup>th</sup> between 7AM and 8PM. On **Tuesday October 18<sup>th</sup> and Monday October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2016** at 7:00 PM, in the second floor City Council Chambers located at Belmont City Hall at One Twin Pines Lane, the Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing to review and discuss the next topic of proposed amendments for the Single-Family Home & Tree Regulation Updates project. The focus of the October 18<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting will be updates to the **Allowable Home Size Regulations**.

This public hearing follows up on successful Community Outreach Workshops held in November & December 2015, and public hearing review and adoption of the following project amendments:

- 1) **Single Family Design Review Process, Residential Design Guidelines/Criteria, General Regulations, and Definitions in February 2016.**
- 2) **Parking Regulations in June 2016.**
- 3) **Secondary Unit Regulations in September 2016.**

The City encourages your participation. Attendees will have an opportunity to express their thoughts and provide comments at this public hearing. This meeting will be televised.

Construction of the pedestrian improvements on Ralston Avenue continues. The installation of the drainage system and wood lagging for the new retaining wall is complete.

On Saturday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, DMZ Builders will be performing construction activity between the hours of 8am-5pm.

Next week, sidewalk demolition and shotcrete placement is scheduled. Once completed, the project will provide a continuous and safe pedestrian sidewalk from South Road to the NDNU entrance by installing new sidewalk and new retaining walls. 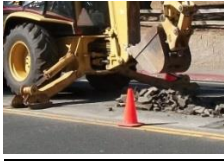

- Cleaned all paving equipment

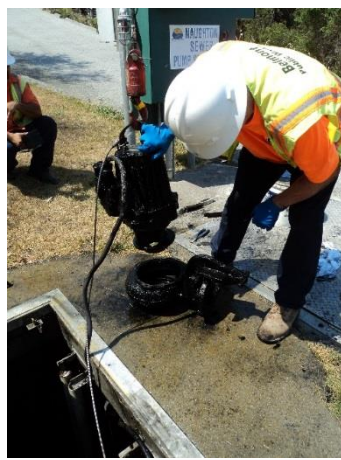

## Sewer Division

- Hydro cleaned 8,698 feet of sewer main
- Emptied 10 city maintained garbage cans around the city
- The service truck (205) responded to 7 service calls
- Inspected and cleaned 11 sewer pump stations
- Cleaned flushable wipes from debris catcher at Ralston Ranch Sewer Pump Station
- Closed out sewer related work orders
- Video inspected 453 feet of sewer line
- Staff hydro-cleaned sewer easements which entails hand pulling jet hose from the truck parked on the street to the manholes on the easements (backyards, open space areas, etc.)
- Continued training new "full time" employee Paul Bologna of the duties of the service truck and combo truck in preparation of him being added to the on-call list
- Used Vector combo truck to clean wet wells at El Camino and Naughton Sewer Pump Stations
- Prepared for planned PG&E outage at Hastings Sewer Pump Station
- Staff responded to a power fault alarm at Hiller Pump station. PG&E power came back on when staff arrived
- Helped Strom Division clean up paper and other garbage from Shoreway Road
- Pulled both pumps at El Camino and Naughton Sewer Pump stations for maintenance

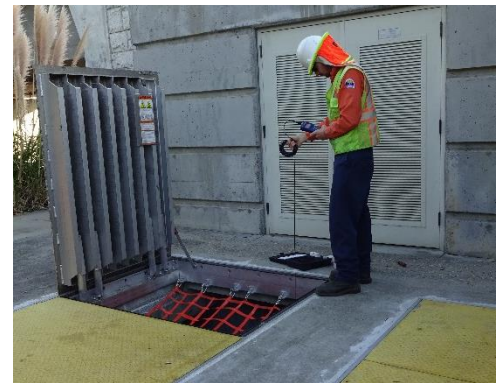

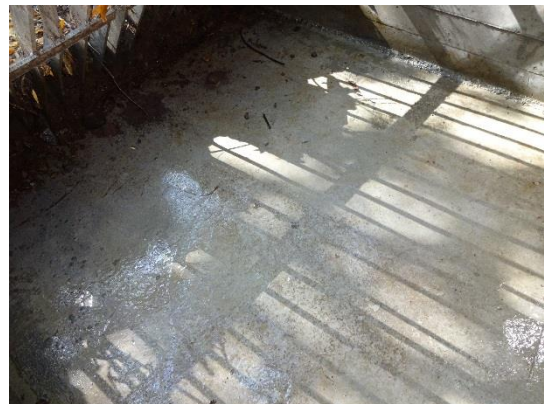
## Storm Division

- Performed twice weekly inspection of Water Dog Lake roadway, v-ditch, dam, dock, and spillway
- Cleaned and inspected both Harbor and Ralston Storm Pump Stations
- Emptied cigarette butt receptacles at 5 locations throughout the City
- Inspected 2,444 feet of storm line through the use of CCTV (closed circuit tv) equipment
- Swept 158 curb miles resulting in the acquisition of 11.76 tons of debris from the roadways
- Cleaned 5 catch basins with our Vactor truck (2 of which contained Full Trash Capture Devices)
- Cleaned the “hot spot” located at the lower gate of Water Dog Lake Road with a backhoe ensuring that it will be ready for the rainy season (*Pictured below*)
- Performed an on land trash cleanup along the west side of Shoreway Road
- Conducted monthly dissolved oxygen testing on the wet wells at Harbor and Ralston pump stations (*Pictured Right*)
- Cleaned the “hot spot” at 2500 Carlmont Drive with our Vactor truck ensuring it will be ready for the rainy season (*Pictured below*)



### Public Works Storm Crew Continues Rainy Season Preparation

In preparation of the upcoming winter season, Public Works Storm Crew was busy cleaning up various hotspots in City neighborhoods. Various city-maintained V-ditches have been cleared of dirt and debris, and storm crew cleaned Carlmont Drive Headwall catch basin, and the Water Dog Lake lower gate inlet. Additionally, in efforts to keep trash out of the storm drains, they conducted an on-land cleanup along Shoreway Road. All these efforts help keep the water flowing, reducing the risk for flooding. Starting October 11<sup>th</sup>, storm crews will start clearing the debris from the headwall and drainage ditch in the back of Hidden Valley Park.

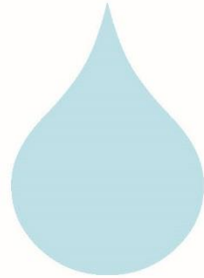
## Save Water, Prevent Stormwater Pollution Install a Rain Barrel

#### Driving Lane Closure and lane shifts



The Ralston Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project is now underway. Construction is currently taking place on Ralston Avenue between South Road and the east NDNU driveway entrance. Construction will require the shifting of the westbound traffic lane and removing the center two-way left turn lanes. Left turns into driveways within the project limits will not be permitted. This traffic lane reconfiguration will be implemented 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the duration of construction. Please anticipate delays and plan your routes accordingly.

#### Driving Lane Closures - Detours in place



Interstate Grading and Paving, Inc. has been contracted by the County of San Mateo to perform resurfacing on upper Ralston at Belmont city limit (@ Christian Drive) to HWY 92. **Working hours for the project are 9:00 am to 3:00 pm Monday through Friday, and 9:00 pm to 6:00 am Sundays through Thursdays.** The work is anticipated to last through October 25th. In this upper portion of Ralston that is in the County, there will be one lane open in each direction during the work. During resurfacing work, the HWY 92 eastbound and westbound on-ramps and off-ramps of HWY 92 will have to be intermittently closed, however, the ramps will not be simultaneously closed.

Detour signs will be posted. **When the County's contractor, Interstate Grading and Paving Inc. will conduct work at Christian and Ralston causing a closure at the intersection, a signed detour will be provided directing residents to/from Ralston, through a two-way detour via Ralston Ranch Road.**

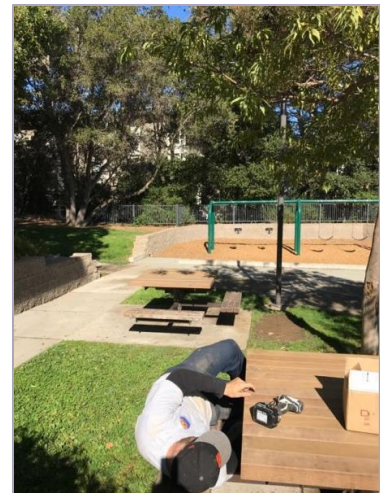
# Parks and Recreation

## Parks



The library received an internet connectivity upgrade this week. Buildings maintenance staff partnered with San Mateo County IT to install new wireless internet routers throughout the library. These new routers will allow increased internet traffic and a more reliable internet connection.

Other maintenance conducted at the library included pressure washing the high traffic entryway concrete. In addition, the boards on the picnic tables were replaced. The existing wood boards had been heavily vandalized and damaged. These were replaced with a vandalism-resistant wood composite material. The new picnic table boards have an attractive look and will be able to be cleaned easier than traditional wood.



Parks maintenance teams partnered with Public Works to clear heavy brush between Lower Lock Avenue and Marsten Avenue. The flail mower was used to clear large sections of heavy brush and poison oak from the open space corridor. Public Works maintains storm drains and runoff culverts in the area and safe access to this infrastructure is necessary.



At Central School, several irrigation repairs were made. Components in an aging, underperforming irrigation valve were replaced and several leaking sprinkler heads were also repaired. The existing galvanized pipe had become corroded and was leaking; this was replaced with pvc pipe.


