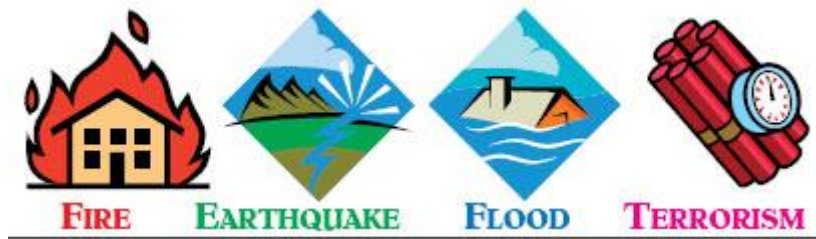

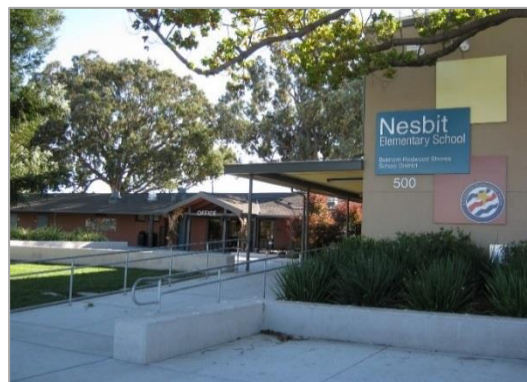

**Ralston Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project Update**



Construction of the pedestrian and ADA improvements on Ralston Avenue is getting closer to completion. Utility box adjustments and remedial work are in progress. Once completed, the project will provide a continuous and safe pedestrian sidewalk from South Road to the NDNU entrance by installing new sidewalk and new retaining walls. **Davey Glen Park Construction Update**

This week, the contractor installed the Poured in Place material for the surface of the playground. This material provides a thick cushioned surface that requires little maintenance while ensuring playground users have a safe and fun surface for playground action. In addition, the boulders were moved into place above the playground. These boulders will be surrounded by tall grasses and will provide a unique natural experience in the park for kids and adults alike.



Next week the contractor will be working to pour concrete for more seat walls, install the rock veneer on the park sign and walls, and start to layout the synthetic turf area.

Current estimate for completion is March 2017.





# Parks and Recreation

## *Parks*

Seasonal turf maintenance is underway as the sports fields are being aerovated and seeded to correct wear and tear. After a season of heavy use and consequent turf compaction, aeration uses a machine with vibrating tines which penetrate the soil and vibrate at such a rate of speed that they break up compaction effectively. Aeration, coupled with seeding and fertilization allow for effective recovery and overall good health of the sports fields.



A vehicle crushed two irrigation boxes when it drove onto the median along El Camino Real. The broken parts were replaced and water was restored to the landscape medians.

The play areas at Hallmark Park and College View Park received new playground fiber this week. Over time the Fibar playground chips become compacted and settle. Engineered wood fiber in play areas offers a soft landing and is aesthetically attractive and has a natural look. The Fibar wood chips are pumped into the play area from a large truck.



Shrubs and trees were trimmed on several medians throughout town. Litter and debris was removed and several irrigation repairs were made.

### **Caltrain Begins Pre-Construction Work on Electrification Project**

From now until the end of February, Caltrain will be performing pre-construction work within the right-of-way as part of the [Peninsula Corridor Electrification Project](#).

During this time, Caltrain will be working on pre-construction activities in the field that include locating utilities, confirming soil conditions and testing cables. The work will primarily take place during the day, but there will be some night activities between 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Residents living near the area of the pre-construction activities are being notified of the work by mail.

To accommodate the work, there may be some single-tracking during non-peak hours and Caltrain passengers should be aware of signs at the stations that let them know to board on a different platform. Once pre-construction is completed, the project team will start construction-related activities in spring/summer 2017. The planned work (pre-construction and full construction) is updated weekly on the website at [www.caltrain.com/PCEP](http://www.caltrain.com/PCEP).

The primary purpose of the PCEP is to improve Caltrain system performance and reduce long-term environmental impact by reducing noise, improving regional air quality and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. A modernized Caltrain system will better address Peninsula commuters' vision of increased service and improved travel times in an environmentally friendly and reliable way. When complete, Caltrain will be cleaner, quieter, and serve more riders. The PCEP is scheduled to be operational by winter 2020/2021.

*About Caltrain: Owned and operated by the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board, Caltrain provides commuter rail service from San Francisco to San Jose, with limited commute service to Gilroy. Caltrain enjoyed five years of consecutive monthly ridership increases, surpassing more than 60,000 average weekday riders earlier this year. While the Joint Powers Board assumed operating responsibilities for the service in 1992, the railroad celebrated 150 years of continuous passenger service in 2014. Planning for the next 150 years of Peninsula rail service, Caltrain is on pace to electrify the system, reduce diesel emissions by 97 percent by 2040 and add more service to more stations.*
